

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5658, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. LYNCH OF MASSACHUSETTS**

Page 353, after line 11, insert the following new section:

1 **SEC. 849. REQUIREMENT FOR REVIEW OF IRAQ RECON-**  
2 **STRUCTION AND TROOP SUPPORT CON-**  
3 **TRACTS INVOLVING CONTRACTORS, SUB-**  
4 **CONTRACTORS, OR FEDERAL OFFICERS OR**  
5 **EMPLOYEES INDICTED OR CONVICTED FOR**  
6 **CONTRACTING IMPROPRIETIES.**

7 (a) **REQUIREMENT FOR REVIEW.**—The Secretary of  
8 Defense, acting through the Director of the Defense Con-  
9 tract Audit Agency, shall conduct a review of each covered  
10 contract to determine if the contract has been the subject  
11 of fraud or any other contracting impropriety.

12 (b) **COVERED CONTRACTS.**—In this Act, the term  
13 “covered contract” means any contract (including a task  
14 or delivery order contract) entered into on or after March  
15 1, 2003, by the Department of Defense, or any sub-  
16 contract or task or delivery order under such a contract,  
17 if the contract, subcontract, or order—

18 (1) is in an amount of \$500,000 or greater;

1           (2) relates to reconstruction or troop support in  
2       Iraq; and

3           (3) involves any contractor, subcontractor, or  
4       Federal officer or employee that has been indicted or  
5       convicted for fraud or any other violation of Federal  
6       law with respect to another contract of the Depart-  
7       ment of Defense relating to such reconstruction or  
8       troop support in Iraq.

9       (c) NOTIFICATION TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary of  
10   Defense shall notify the committees listed in subsection  
11   (d) when the review required under this section begins.

12       (d) DEADLINE AND REPORT.—Not later than 180  
13   days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
14   retary of Defense shall complete the review required under  
15   this section and submit a report on the results of the re-  
16   view to—

17           (1) the Committees on Armed Services and on  
18       Oversight and Government Reform of the House of  
19       Representatives; and

20           (2) the Committees on Armed Services and on  
21       Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the  
22       Senate.
