

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 3908, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. LEWIS OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of chapter 2 of title II (page 20, after line 10), insert the following new sections:

1 SEC. 2207. (a) QUALITY OF LIFE PROGRAMS.—In
2 addition to amounts appropriated or otherwise made avail-
3 able for the Department of Defense elsewhere in this Act
4 or in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2000
5 (Public Law 106-79), there is hereby appropriated to the
6 Department of Defense, to remain available for obligation
7 until September 30, 2001, \$231,000,000, of which—

8 (1) \$221,000,000 is available only for the Basic
9 Allowance for Housing program, as follows:

10 “Military Personnel, Army”, \$70,000,000;

11 “Military Personnel, Navy”, \$56,000,000;

12 “Military Personnel, Marine Corps”,
13 \$17,100,000;

14 “Military Personnel, Air Force”,
15 \$58,600,000;

16 “Reserve Personnel, Army”, \$4,100,000;

17 “Reserve Personnel, Navy”, \$4,000,000;

18 “Reserve Personnel, Marine Corps”,
19 \$600,000;

20 “Reserve Personnel, Air Force”, \$300,000;

1 “National Guard Personnel, Army”,
2 \$6,900,000; and

3 “National Guard Personnel, Air Force”,
4 \$3,400,000; and

5 (2) \$10,000,000 is available only for “Oper-
6 ation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide”, for the over-
7 seas special supplemental food program established
8 under section 1060a of title 10, United States Code.

9 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.—The entire amount
10 made available in this section is designated by the Con-
11 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
12 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
13 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

14 SEC. 2208. (a) MILITARY RECRUITING, ADVER-
15 TISING, AND RETENTION PROGRAMS.—In addition to
16 amounts appropriated or otherwise made available for the
17 Department of Defense elsewhere in this Act or in the De-
18 partment of Defense Appropriations Act, 2000 (Public
19 Law 106-79), there is hereby appropriated to the Depart-
20 ment of Defense, to remain available for obligation until
21 September 30, 2001, and to be available only for military
22 personnel recruiting, advertising, and retention programs,
23 \$600,600,000, as follows:

24 (1) For military personnel accounts,
25 \$450,600,000, as follows:

1 “Military Personnel, Army”, \$76,400,000;
2 “Military Personnel, Navy”, \$69,100,000;
3 “Military Personnel, Marine Corps”,
4 \$6,000,000;

21 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy”,
22 \$26,200,000;
23 “Operation and Maintenance, Marine
24 Corps”, \$14,700,000;

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force”,

3 “Operation and Maintenance, Defense-
4 Wide”, \$8,800,000;

5 “Operation and Maintenance, Army Re-
6 serve”, \$11,900,000;

7 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy Re-

18 made available in this section is designated by the Con-
19 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
20 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
21 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

22 SEC. 2209. (a) DEFENSE HEALTH PROGRAM.—In
23 addition to amounts appropriated or otherwise made avail-
24 able for the Department of Defense elsewhere in this Act
25 or in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2000

1 (Public Law 106-79), there is hereby appropriated, to re-
2 main available for obligation until September 30, 2001,
3 \$750,000,000 for “Defense Health Program”.

4 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.—The entire amount
5 made available in this section is designated by the Con-
6 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
7 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
8 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

9 SEC. 2210. (a) DEPOT-LEVEL MAINTENANCE AND
10 REPAIR.—In addition to amounts appropriated or other-
11 wise made available for the Department of Defense else-
12 where in this Act or in the Department of Defense Appro-
13 priations Act, 2000 (Public Law 106-79), there is hereby
14 appropriated to the Department of Defense, to remain
15 available for obligation until September 30, 2001, and to
16 be available only for depot-level maintenance and repair,
17 \$1,205,600,000, as follows:

18 “Operation and Maintenance, Army”,

19 \$200,000,000;

20 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy”,

21 \$538,800,000;

22 “Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps”,

23 \$50,000,000;

24 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force”,

25 \$250,000,000;

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy Reserve”,
2 \$33,000,000;

3 “Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps Re-
4 serve”, \$5,000,000;

5 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force Re-
6 serve”, \$37,200,000; and

7 “Operation and Maintenance, Air National
8 Guard”, \$91,600,000.

9 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.—The entire amount
10 made available in this section is designated by the Con-
11 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
12 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
13 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

14 SEC. 2211. (a) HIGH PRIORITY SUPPORT TO DE-
15 PLOYED FORCES.—In addition to amounts appropriated
16 or otherwise made available for the Department of De-
17 fense elsewhere in this Act or in the Department of De-
18 fense Appropriations Act, 2000 (Public Law 106-79),
19 there is hereby appropriated to the Department of De-
20 fense, for the support of deployed forces as specified in
21 subsection (b), \$1,212,700,000, as follows:

22 (1) For operation and maintenance accounts, to
23 remain available for obligation until September 30,
24 2001, \$738,900,000, as follows:

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Army”,
2 \$200,000,000;

3 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy”,
4 \$310,300,000;

5 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force”,
6 \$197,000,000; and

7 “Operation and Maintenance, Defense-
8 Wide”, \$31,600,000.

9 (2) For procurement accounts, to remain avail-
10 able for obligation until September 30, 2002,
11 \$405,800,000, as follows:

12 “Aircraft Procurement, Army”,
13 \$50,000,000, to be available only for Apache
14 helicopter safety and reliability modifications;

15 “Missile Procurement, Army”,
16 \$50,000,000, to be available only for the Pa-
17 triot missile reliability enhancement program;

18 “Aircraft Procurement, Navy”,
19 \$52,800,000, of which \$27,000,000 is available
20 only for CH-46 helicopter engine safety pro-
21 curement and \$25,800,000 is available only for
22 EP-3 sensor improvements and modifications;

23 “Aircraft Procurement, Air Force”,
24 \$209,700,000, of which \$111,600,000 is avail-
25 able only for U-2 reconnaissance aircraft sensor

1 modifications and \$98,100,000 is available only
2 for flight training simulators;

3 “Other Procurement, Air Force”,
4 \$30,300,000; and

5 “Procurement, Defense-Wide”,
6 \$13,000,000.

7 (3) For research, development, test and evalua-
8 tion accounts, to remain available for obligation until
9 September 30, 2001, \$68,000,000, as follows:

10 “Research, Development, Test and Evalua-
11 tion, Air Force”, \$10,000,000, to be available
12 only for a JSTARS aircraft mission trainer;
13 and

14 “Research, Development, Test and Evalua-
15 tion, Defense-Wide”, \$58,000,000.

16 (b) SPECIFIED PURPOSES.—Amounts appropriated
17 in this section are available only for the provision to de-
18 ployed United States forces of—

19 (1) equipment safety and reliability enhance-
20 ments;

21 (2) improved materiel and logistics support; and

22 (3) upgraded intelligence, surveillance, and re-
23 connaissance (ISR) capabilities.

24 (c) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.—The entire amount
25 made available in this section is designated by the Con-

1 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
2 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
3 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.
